This has been an eventful year for CHPV, Succeeding Gary Worcester, I became the chair of the CHPV Board in April, 2021. A few months later, our very capable Executive Director, Michelle Dassinger, resigned. Michelle strongly suggested that we explore hiring a full-time ED.

After discussion with the Board of Directors, we formed a committee with Barbara Norrish, Joanne Michalski and myself to begin the search for a full-time executive director. We also had to plan for the interim period. Fortunately, we had already begun the search for an Administrative Coordinator and we hired Laura Voss-Allen for that position. Michelle continued to work with Joanne on the financials and Dorothy and Laura stepped up to manage the day-to-day operations of CHPV. Barbara, Joanne and I met with the staff each week to enable planning and coordination. I want to express my appreciation for all who participated in this effort.

After narrowing the number of applicants to seven, in December we hired Lucas Livingston as our full-time Executive Director. Lucas brings a wealth of experience and talent to CHPV. During his twenty years at the Art Institute, he planned and carried out various experiences of art education for older adults. We are very pleased with the way he has gotten to know the history, programs and members of CHPV. He also has some very creative ideas about how we might grow and expand our programs in the future.

During the pandemic the Program Committee has continued to provide stimulating and thoughtful presentations for the twice monthly Drop Ins. We have been very pleased to discover how many of our members have become comfortable with Zoom. We have plans to begin meeting in person at least once a month.

During the pandemic our dedicated staff have continued to provide services to our members, particularly drives to medical appointments. Thank you Lucas, Dorothy, and Laura.

We have continued to work with the University of Chicago Community Program Accelerator to strengthen our internal capabilities. The Board participated in three workshops with Will Gossin from the Harris School of Public Policy. The opportunity to meet in person and share our hopes and dreams for CHPV was extremely beneficial.

With Lucas on board and with the support of Dorothy and Laura, we are looking forward to a very interesting and productive year. Our success in fulfilling our mission of being an intentional caring community of neighbors helping neighbors will require the best efforts of all of us.




