

Pride Flags



Gilbert Baker Pride Flag

Created in 1977 by Gilbert Baker. Inspired by the song "Over the Rainbow." Each color represents something different.

Hot pink symbolizes sex

Red is life

Orange is healing

Yellow is sunlight

Green is for nature

Turquoise stands for magic and art

Indigo is for serenity

Violet stands for the spirit of the LGBT people.



Progress Flag

This flag integrates a few of the different pride flags into it, and was redesigned to place a greater emphasis on "inclusion and progress." We see the six colors of the rainbow from the most commonly known pride flag. The brown and black stripes are reminiscent of the philadelphia pride flag, and the baby blue, pink, and white stripes are the colors from the trans pride flag. The chevron arrow is meant to stand for forward progress.
